<b>NORTHERN IRELAND</b>			
Ballymacanallen Community Association	Mrs Sergeant's Boys	£4,715	This project will promote community integration by drawing 'then and now' comparisons between how serving personnel were treated by their wider local communities in WW1 and today. It will use a compelling, factual account of an ordinary family from a small community and how six brothers survived the conflict's horrors. This project brings commemorations to life; involving serving personnel, veterans and civilian communities. The presentation in booklet and DVD format will ensure a legacy for the incredible WW1 story to be told and retold to new audiences from schools to historical societies in years ahead. The equipment purchased for the project will also be reused for other local projects exploring Armed Forces history in the local area.
Ballymena Sea Cadets	Ballymena Sea Cadets Kayaking in Partnership with AAVSNI	£10,800	The project will enable sea cadets aged 10-18 to work together as a team using 10 modern kayaks purchased along with a kayak trailer, to transport the vessels and associated equipment. The children will gain water skills and develop confidence. The project will also support Armed Forces veterans - particularly injured veterans and their families.
The Army Sailing Association, Northern Ireland	ASA NI Inshore Fleet Replacement	£20,000	The organisation purchased a fleet of new dinghies to replace ageing craft that were unfit for purpose and becoming unsafe. This meant sailing courses and regattas could be held to bring civilian and Armed Forces communities together
Newtownards Sea Cadets	Newtownards Sea Cadets Boating	£19,306	The grant will fund the purchase of safety boats complete with trailers for a sea cadet unit. The equipment will allow the unit to expand, cadets would benefit from using the equipment to become more confident around the water and work efficiently as a team. The boats will also be used by veterans and their families.

Army Welfare Service Northern Ireland (AWS NI)	HEROS Programme (Hockey Education Reaching Out)	£19,612	The Hockey Education Reaching Out to Society (HEROS) programme is an initiative to encourage young people to form relationships across individual backgrounds, by breaking down barriers to integration. The project will use ice hockey as a way to engage the interest of a diverse group of young people, whilst promoting healthy eating, confidence, self-esteem, team working skills and physical activity. Wherever possible, the Army Welfare Service (AWS) will use military facilities.
38 (Irish) Bde	Horse-assisted coaching for empowerment, leadership	£20,000	having difficulty settling into or maintaining everyday life. The project involved the use of 'Equine therapy' where grooming and taking care of horses was used as a way by which veterans could relieve their anxiety. The course also provides information on accessing mental health advice and offers support in gaining employment.
<b>SCOTLAND</b>			
Highland Hall RBLS Nairn Branch	Legion Hall Solar	£7,200	The Legion Hall is used by 20+ local organisations throughout the year and donations are received from users only to cover the heating costs. This makes the venue accessible to all and provides strong focal point for events and community integration in a small town. Solar panels and improved insulation mean these costs can be kept down and will help ensure the future of Nairn branch.
Kinloch Historical Society	Our Military Connection - An Island Legacy	£11,700	The project will secure a collection of 24 uniforms and other artefacts in one space, spanning from the Zulu war and WW1 to more recent tours to Afghanistan through an earlier exhibition, which brought organisers into contact with a collector and a local historian. It is a lasting memorial to those who served or are currently serving and is a unique piece of work, which champions the Armed Forces, brings veterans together to share experiences and fosters development of stronger ties with younger generations through schools. Community integration is at the heart of the exhibition; and it will be designed to break down barriers and improve understanding of the roles of regulars and reservists. It will be a permanent exhibition and a local focal point in the heart of the Island of Lewis community, where people can better understand the role of the Armed Forces and feel more enabled in helping those returning from service to reintegrate.

Helensburgh Sea Cadets (Ts Neptune)	Helensburgh Sea Cadets replacement minibus	£15,000	This project will provide the Sea Cadet unit with a replacement mini bus. The Cadets are from Armed Forces Families and the local civilian community. Transport is essential to the unit, specifically to collect the cadets for drill evenings and get them home safely afterwards. The new minibus will mean that more junior cadets can be included, and the group will be able to tow boats to safe water enable the Cadets to take part in sailing and canoeing.
Orkney Sea Cadets	Minibus and Garage for Orkney's Junior Uniformed Groups	£15,000	This project will provide a minibus and storage for junior uniformed groups based in Orkney. It will be used by Cadet groups and Scout groups; enabling young people to engage in a range of positive activities
Rosie Kay Dance Company Ltd	5 Soldiers- The Body is The Frontline Scottish Tour and Community Engagement Programme	£18,000	Soldiers toured Scotland to bring an acclaimed dance act to theatres and Armed Forces venues. The work, Five Soldiers, is a moving and unique exploration into how important the human body is to warfare - even in the 21st Century. The events will include a professional show, post show talks with Armed Forces and arts representation plus additional performances by local groups at each location. At its core, the project is about transforming perceptions and building bridges between the Scottish Armed Forces and civilian communities.

Sacro	The Veteran's Mentoring Service	£20,000	Sacro's Veterans Mentoring Service will work with local communities; military organisations and community based resources to apply a holistic multi-disciplinary approach to case managing vulnerable veterans. The significant sacrifice that many veterans have made for their communities is recognised, whilst the intensive peer mentoring approach assists veterans to cope with the transition into civilian life. The veterans will be encouraged and supported to seek employment or education, to offer peer support to other veterans and to take part in community based activities which support their continued development and enhance social inclusion.

TS Mountbatten Sea Cadets Unit No 17 - Ayr	Ayr Sea Cadets - Get Rowing 2016	£20,000	The project will provide funding for new boats and a trailer, which will be used by the Ayrshire Coastal Rowing Community as well as with partners within South Ayrshire Council, Primary Schools and Outdoor Learning & Active Schools teams. The boats will be used at local events.
Rhu & Shandon Community Centre	New Gas Central Heating System for Rhu & Shandon Community Centre	£20,000	Rhu and Shandon Community Centre opened in 1905 and since then has been serving the local community as a venue for a wide range of activities . The community centre is located near HMNB Clyde. The grant will enable this community centre to be refurbished with a new central heating system; so that it can continue to be a base for local activities that bring military and civilian communities together
Royal British Legion Scotland Grangemouth Branch	Legion Scotland Grangemouth Branch-Preparing For The Future	£20,000	This grant will fund refurbishments and improvements to the building, in particularly to meet the needs of older veterans, and to enable the building to be used by a variety of local organisations.
Salvation Army	New Future project	£20,000	The New Future project works with unemployed people to help them to move towards work and qualifications. This project offers opportunities for veterans to engage in mentoring activities.
St John and Red Cross Defence Medical Welfare Service (DMWS)	Defence Medical Welfare Service - Highland & Grampian Welfare Support	£20,000	This project will provide a medical welfare service to the Armed Forces community in Highlands and Grampian council areas. The project will work with the NHS, LAs, AFs and the voluntary sector across parts of Scotland. It will facilitate referrals to other services, reduce inappropriate referrals, reduce likelihood of families getting into crisis and enable service users to access emotional and practical support to aid their recovery.
Housing Options Scotland	Military Matters - Housing Advice for Armed Forces Families	£20,000	Focusing on housing advice for the Armed Forces community in Scotland, the project will improve the quality of information and to especially support families who have 'fallen through the cracks.' The idea has been to focus specifically on coordination between MOD, serving units and families, to address gaps in provision of information and services (as highlighted by the Scottish veterans Commissioner and a report by Lord Ashcroft.
Citizens Advice Bureau West Lothian	First Contact	£2,160	The project design, produce and distribute a booklet, entitled 'Get Help ASAP' . This booklet outlined the services available from the Armed Services Advice Project within the areas of West Lothian, Midlothian, East Lothian and the City of Edinburgh.

B.A.S.I.C (SCIO)	B.A.S.I.C and Cornerhouse Crèche	£5,900	The creche cares for children aged 1-3; and is based near HMNB Clyde. It is used by members of the Armed Forces Community and Civilian communities, promoting integration
The First Base Agency	The Carnsalloch Veterans Garden Project	£7,500	This project will enable veterans to come together in a safe environment where people can be out in the fresh air. It will reduce isolation, and have a positive impact on wellbeing. Veterans can share positive time together; and be signposted to services that can meet wider needs. The grant will be used for equipment they need for their plant beds and greenhouses.
39 Engineer Regiment	Cumming Hall	£11,593	This grant will be used to obtain furniture for Cumming Hall; which is used by the Army Welfare Service and other organisations, and can be used as a space for community engagement activities
Combat Stress (Ex-Services Mental Welfare Society)	Tools for Life	£11,901	The organisation will invite 20 veterans of Combat Stress to take part in Common Wheel's 'Build Your Own Bike' course. This is to provide meaningful time and social interaction for veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. The ten week course is led by an experienced bike engineer within a full equipped professional workshop.
Edinburgh & Lothians Greenspace Trust	Hunters Tryst Woodland renewal	£18,200	The project will involve armed forces, their families and the wider community in a programme of community activity and participation session to transform, improve and maintain sections of urban woodland in Dreghorn/Colinton in south Edinburgh. The woodlands act as a very physical barrier between the predominantly military residential areas and the neighbouring civilian communities but have great potential as a valuable local amenity and as traffic-free connections through the surrounding areas.
Motherwell & Wishaw Citizens Advice Bureau	Veterans Employability & Transition Support	£19,040	The organisation will employ an employability officer to deliver an employability programme across Lanarkshire that is suitable for veterans, early service leavers, serving personnel transition and those being discharged via ill health.
The Royal Caledonian Education Trust	Forces Kids Live	£19,480	The organisation will bring an original theatre production, 'Forces Kids' which piloted in 2015, to a range of additional schools across Scotland. The live drama takes key messages and presents them in an age appropriate way to primary age pupils. The production and learning resources aim to increase awareness of the challenges Armed Forces children could face, in particular dealing with separation and moving schools, to improve teachers' knowledge and confident to support armed forces children, and to increase opportunities for young peoples' voices to be heard in respect of the support they receive.

Project 81 Youth and Community Enterprise Ltd	Integra81	£19,680	The project is intended to increase the numbers of Armed Forces families using the facilities available at Centre 81 and the services provided by their youth initiative. Staff time will be dedicated to reaching out to armed forces families, to understand the barriers for them in accessing the services and take action to reduce or eliminate those, and to improve delivery of services.
Scottish Association for Mental Health	SAMH Veterans families employment support	£19,681	SAMH will deliver a pilot veterans' families employment support project in Edinburgh. The overall aim of the service is to improve employment prospects for this target group by delivery a holistic employment-focussed support incorporating elements of mental health support.
Women's Enterprise Scotland	Business ideas / startup education for spouses	£19,895	The funding will be towards a programme to inspire, motivate and inform forces spouses on the benefits and challenges of business creation and start-up.
St John and Red Cross Defence Medical Welfare Service (DMWS)	Defence Medical Welfare Service - Lothian Welfare	£20,000	This project will support individuals from the Armed Forces Community (AFC) to ensure that they are referred to the right place to access the services they require. They will work with the NHS, and with veterans in hospital to provide additional support to try to reduce the length of stay in hospital, and help the veteran achieve better outcomes
The Tower Digital Arts Centre	Faslane Cinema Audio Upgrade	£20,000	The funding is to upgrade the sound system at the Tower Arts Centre. The Centre operates a cinema for MOD personnel outside the local base, and in the community. Families are brought by bus from HMNB Clyde to the town centre cinema.
Eastriggs and Gretna Heritage Group	A Permanent Record of Their Service	£20,000	The organisation will carry out an oral history project. They will interview service personnel to record their thoughts and experience and workshops will be arranged with organisations such as Legion Scotland Annan Branch and Dumfries RAF Association to encourage discussion. The aim of the project is to involve local people in recording the contribution to the defence of our country made by local armed forces personnel from WWII right up to the present day.
St. Mark's R.C. Primary School	Expanding Outdoor Learning opportunities	£19,200	The school will initiate an outdoor learning programme, co-ordinated with Scotland's Forest Schools. The experiences that children have can lead to an increase in self-reliance and hence an increase in self-esteem and self-confidence. This is especially important with the MOD children attending the school. Around 20% of the school's children are from MOD families.

Dementia Service Development Trust (DSDT)	Helpful hints for veterans with dementia	£20,000	Veterans Scotland and DSDT will pilot a support workshop scheme in Falkirk and District which provides advice to veterans and their families living with dementia. Workshops should empower those who attend, giving them the knowledge they need to live life to the full with a diagnosis of dementia
<b>WALES</b>			
Llangwm Community Centre	WW1 - A Village at War	£9,659	To commemorate the Battle of the Somme, Llangwm Community Centre in partnership with the local History Society and choir will have a concert performance of "WW1 - A Village at War", at St. David's Cathedral, Pembrokeshire. This will involve people from three local choirs including military wives. Links will be developed with local bases as part of the project
Time Banking Wales	The Adventures of Mrs RFA Orangeleaf and Friends	£15,950	The project will produce an animation based on the popular children's book series 'The Adventures Of Mrs. RFA Orangeleaf' written by Ex-serviceman Pierre Cornlouer. The author has 30 years experience of military conflict in the Armed Forces and in this book and subsequent film, aims to help children understand what the Services do. This animation would help families with small children understand the variety of duties our Armed Service personnel undertake, which are sometimes overlooked by the media. The voice over artists will be ex-forces personal some of whom have suffered from post traumatic stress and are disconnected from their very own community. This project will help integrate members of the forces back into the community as part of their resettlement, work through their experiences, develop skills and confidence, especially in communication, and enable their engagement in this wider community project. Young people from the Armed Forces cadets will also play a part in this project.
The Friends of The Royal Welsh Regimental Museum, Brecon	Never Forget Your Welsh Heroes	£18,951	The project will archive material from the Zulu War (1879), Boer War (1902) and all combat areas of WW1, scanning hundreds of documents and putting these online so that they can be accessed more widely. The documents include letters, diaries and photographs. Volunteers will transcribe the letters and diaries; and links will be made with other organisations
Gwynedd County Council	Strengthening Access to Support	£10,300	Gwynedd Council will lead on work to co-ordinate support services for current and former armed services personnel within Gwynedd. The council will run events, lead activities and undertake training to nurture public understanding and awareness of the issues affecting the armed forces community, and encourage integration

Amgueddfa Cymru National Museum Wales	Take a Seat	£16,350	This project will install a series of 15 benches along one of the pathways of the St Fagans National History Museum, involving local army veterans who each had mental health problems, and some with physical disabilities too. This will allow the site to become more accessible for disabled and elderly visitors, as each bench also had a wheelchair space beside it. St Fagans is a popular space with veterans, and allows them to relax in open space and socialise with peers.
Mount Street Infant and Nursery School	Mount Street Infants Community	£17,500	The school will develop an area of the playground to provide a social space for the parents of military and civilian children to meet informally before and after school. 30% of the school roll are service children and the transient service families sometimes have difficulty integrating into this small community.
West Wales Action for Mental Health	Veterans Lead Mental Health Development Worker	£20,000	The grant will fund a Veterans Lead Mental Health Development Worker to work with veterans with mental health needs
<b>EAST</b>			
Workshop Sea Cadets	Upgrade of Unit Staff and Male Cadet Facilities	£10,000	This refurbishment project will improve the facilities for the Cadets; and will mean that the facility can also be used by other groups in the local area; promoting integration
The Bridge for Heroes	Military Experience Day and Education Centre (MEDEC), Outreach project	£16,000	The project will deliver a number of integration events. It will train veterans in public speaking to empower them to deliver local talks and presentations; and a holiday club will be run to provide activities on site for children and young people. It will also include intergenerational events between veterans and young people.
Rosmini Centre Wisbech	Community - New friends, new places & new challenges.	£19,630	The project will engage with people who are socially isolated and who had previously found difficulty in making friends in the local area; targeted towards veterans but also open more widely. They will run a range of activities to reduce isolation, and will signpost people with needs to appropriate services.
Hartsbourne Primary School	The Decorated Duck (Pastoral Support Centre)	£19,659	This is the final stage of the 'Decorated Duck' building project, which will enhance the existing pre-fabricated community space to facilitate integration between Armed Forces and civilian parents and communities. Adding a timber-framed structure to provide a sheltered outdoor space will allow more activities to take place within a safe community café setting, which has improved disabled access, enhanced entry security, a parents waiting area and will include a children wall mural.

Goodwill Solutions (Community Interest Company)	ESTABLISH - A "wrap-around employability based support" project	£20,000	ESTABLISH will deliver targeted interventions to assist service leavers with the adjustment to civilian life and change their lives for the better - especially those involved in the criminal justice system and who would benefit from mentor and peer support through their transition. This will be achieved through a multi-agency approach, working in tandem with existing general local authority service provision, to address the myriad complex needs of individual veterans - leading to meaningful and sustainable self-progression.
Business in the Community	VETS East	£9,500	This project will improve existing transition support system in to a programme that provides employment outcomes for veterans and employers in East Anglia. This is in recognition of the issues faced by many service personnel when they seek employment following a period of deployment.
7 Infantry Brigade and Headquarters East	Toton Tigers U14 Tour 2016	£1,525	Funding will enable an under 14s football league to attend a tournament in Germany, against a team made up of service dependents. The grant covered the costs of tracksuits and team polo-shirts for the children. This will promote interaction from both service personnel and civilian groups.
Bassetlaw District Council	Wings over Worksop	£2,200	The project will deliver an event and a series of activities to commemorate Squadron Leader Wladyslaw Jan Nowak, as the first Polish pilot to shoot down a German plane at night, but also in his work to support refugee communities in Worksop after the war. The event will involve unveiling of a plaque memorial, a bench and the provision of fact sheets to the local junior and secondary school. A community event with representatives of Armed Forces and the Polish community will also be held, to celebrate the contribution of the Poles to the RAF.
7 Inf Bde and HQ East Personnel Recovery Unit	The ForcesBikeShed	£5,700	The grant will support the purchase of tools and equipment to support further development of the ForcesBikeShed and enable the project to become self sufficient. They will seek to look at ways to involve people from the local civilian population to promote community integration.
After Armed Conflict CIC	Community in uniform	£19,390	This project will enable civilian emergency service personnel and armed forces personnel to share their experiences of service and develop new networks of support. There will be three phase approach of outreach to existing organisations, creative workshops and events and at the end there will be a conference and exhibition of successes.

Digby War Memorial Hall Management Committee	Digby War Memorial Hall Refurbishment Project	£20,000	The grant will support the refurbishment of the Digby War Memorial Hall. There will be improvements to emergency lighting and the heating system. This will encourage a greater amount of users, and more activities being offered which promotes greater interaction.
23 Parachute Engineer Regiment & Sutton Heath Parish	Rock Barracks Skate Park	£20,000	This regiment is based in an isolated area. Funding will rebuild and refurbish an old, disused skate park, which is located in a military quarter area. There are a number of children living in the local area.
Lincolnshire County Council	Lincolnshire Memories and Memorials	£20,000	Funding will support the promotion of the previously Covenant funded project called 'Lincolnshire Memories and Memorials'. Young people will use the information gathered by the project and design, produce and promote a guided war memorial trail. This will promote integration by encouraging young people to hear the stories of veterans as they design this trail. The guided walks that the children design could further be used as a resource to promote awareness and understanding of the roles played by the Armed Forces in the local area.
The Matthew Project	Outside the Wire	£15,743	This project will target vulnerable veterans within the prison system in Norfolk. Funding will allow the appointment of a part time recovery work, who will build rapport with the veterans whilst still in prison, and support them once they are released.

Reading Force	Reading Force resource for welfare and pastoral support	£12,575	This project will produce an informative printed and electronic brochure resource for welfare/pastoral workers, espousing the benefits of shared reading for pleasure and mitigating life stress. Through this, the project aims to reach a wider audience and bring the benefits of shared reading to more Armed Forces children and their families – by supporting high quality family time especially during difficulties and challenges.
Ealing Cycling Campaign	Re-Cycle your way	£15,350	A bicycle recycling project with ex-service personnel and their families. Individuals will select a donated bike that requires repair and over the project's duration these are restored to a rideable condition, which they will then keep. Project provides skills workshop, means of personal transport and health and safety knowledge.
Islington Music Forum Ltd.	Key Changes Veterans Music Club	£18,550	A six-month programme of creative and vocational music activities, which promotes recovery from severe psychiatric illness for ex-serving personnel receiving treatment at the Camden and Islington NHS Foundation Trust London Veterans' Service.

Stoll - formerly Sir Oswald Stoll Foundation	Stoll in the Community	£19,600	The project aims to improve integration by increasing the charity's own profile amongst the wider civilian community - championing its work in support of vulnerable and disabled ex-service personnel – by engaging veterans with local schools to encourage WW1 and WW2 historical projects, tours, an archive and various community events.
Skills & Care CIC	Together We Grow	£20,000	Development of an allotment space provided by Greenwich local authority into a local meeting place for ex and serving personnel, their families and friends, involving refurbishment of an abandoned concrete shed into an info point, horticultural library and crafts shop. The wider site was cleared by Gurkha and civilian volunteers in readiness for the next stage of work. Activities on the site are tailored to different groups with horticulture-related training for e.g. wives, the elderly and people living with mental health issues.
Croydon Commitment Ltd	Armed Forces Community Lunch	£3,000	The project will deliver a Community Lunch in Croydon, providing an opportunity for networking. This project will invite veterans from the local area to share a meal and interact with civilians also. People from the local business community will also attend the Lunch and help in the delivery of the project. This will allow interaction between them and the ex-service personnel, encouraging conversations about business opportunities or skills training.
HMS President	Tower Hamlets Community Engagement Project	£10,960	The project will support students between the ages of 14 and 18, to access 5 days of sailing training with the Ocean Youth Trust South, which is a charity affiliated with the HMS PRESIDENT Royal Navy Reserves Unit. This project aims to provide young people with leaderships, team building and time management skills, whilst also fostering positive relations between the Navy unit and local schools and youth clubs.
Shared Enterprise CIC	Kingston Shared Enterprise Club	£19,475	This project will establish an entrepreneurial club in the heart of an estate in the local area. The estate has a large population of Armed Forces Personnel, and the club would allow a space within which members of both service and civilian groups could bond over shared interests and ideas. This club would take place fortnightly over a period of 9 months. Funding would also allow co-ordination of these projects, develop resources and invite external speakers.
Faith Matters Community Interest Company	Informing, Engaging and Supporting Joint Futures	£19,690	Deliver events in local schools to encourage integration; members of the Armed Forces will come in to schools to educate young people on the role the military play. A social media campaign to encourage the Muslim community to engage, and help reduce negative perceptions of the army.

Westminster Archives	Not Forgotten	£19,905	This project will educate local people about the important role played by the Armed Forces. Phase one involves commemoration of the Somme and the reinstallation of the Westminster Council Staff War Memorial. This will involve outreach sessions with children across ten different schools, and workshops at the Westminster Archives on the theme of conflict with a children's author. A service is also planned. The second phase will work with children involving them in Remembrance Week at Westminster Abbey. This includes Archive workshops, a visit to the local war memorial and to some military themed Museums.
The Royal Tank Regiment	RTR Military Ethos Rugby Project	£20,000	The Royal Tank Regiment will establish a rugby club for local youth, particularly from the Feltham Young Offenders Institution. The club will be run by military personnel, both serving and retired. The funding will be used for equipment and uniforms.
The Heritage of London Trust Operations Ltd	St George's, Woolwich: transition	£20,000	The project will bring new audiences to St George's, including local residents, community groups, local schools, young people, and visitors from outside the borough of Greenwich. The outreach events will raise the profile of the site amongst the local Woolwich communities and beyond, improving understanding of its significance as the remains of a Victorian church building, embodying the history of the Royal Artillery in Woolwich, as well as its more recent history. A downloadable Learning Pack will be an enduring legacy, and will continue to be promoted by the Woolwich Garrison Church Trust and by visiting schools.

North Yorkshire County Council Carnagill & Wavell Children's Centre	Ride Safe Family Activities	£6,570	The project will deliver a range of youth and family cycling skills days to foster safer riding on public roads - delivered through the Children's Centre Network. There is a priority on this project to support integration and resettlement of returning military families to Catterick Garrison after postings elsewhere.
